July 21<sup>st</sup> 3656 kg of scientific equipment (mainly Viessmann cabins for drillers and logging) and resupply plus 6541 L / 11680 lbs of fuel from SFJ to EGRIP by 109<sup>th</sup> NYANG.

1360 kg of personal field equipment, empty pallets, straps etc. from EGRIP to SFJ by 109<sup>th</sup> NYANG.

## Camp activities:

The skiway markers were maintained and the skiway was groomed in preparation of the flight Thursday. The flight Thursday marked the end of the 2016 period with Distinguished Visitors at EGRIP. The groups: A television group, a policy maker group, a group of senior scientists, and a group of politicians all expressed their thanks for the hospitality received at EGRIP. With the flight on Thursday camp also had its last major crew exchange this year, and camp received the last items for camp construction and a fuel re-supply. As the floor in the core buffer was found to be too high compared to the freshly levelled floor in the logging tunnel, it was decided to remove the ice core shelves, lower the floor and put the shelves back in place. Several vehicles were maintained during the week. A water shortage on Saturday was caused by a forgotten plug in the dishwasher that nearly drained the main snowmelter.

### Science activities:

The surface-snow sampling program is still ongoing. The water vapour sampling and measurement site is still online. Preparations to begin re-measurement of the 2015 strain network positions and expand the strain network. A table in the drill trench was made ready to receive freshly drilled cores for logging and documentation. The pore close off depth in EGRIP core is at 62 m. The pilot hole for the casing was decided to be deep enough and the drilling was terminated for this year.

Sunday logging depth (final 2016 depth): 108.73 m.

#### **Drilling activities:**

In the drill trench, the HT has been mounted on the shallow drill tower and drilling of the first core sections of the deep EGRIP ice core was done Tuesday. By the end of the week, drilling reached a depth of 108.73 m. During this first drilling week, drillers spent time adjusting the drill configuration for optimum core quality. The function of a bip-indication of drill rotation was not functioning and it was determined that one of the wires in the drill cable was damaged at the termination. This will be repaired next week.

#### Weather at EGRIP:

Summer is at EGRIP, with clear weather or few scattered clouds during day, and ground fog and low overcast in the morning. Winds normally 3 - 6 m/s from westerly sectors with a few short periods of calm. In the beginning of the week, one night down to  $-20^{\circ}$  C otherwise night temperatures between - 6 to  $- 10^{\circ}$ 

C. On Thursday, day temperatures reached -  $2^{\circ}$ C, but most of the week daytime temperatures were at -4 to -10°C. We had a few short episodes with light snowfall.

# Kangerlussuaq activities:

We have been composing loads and packing pallets for the flight on Thursday 21<sup>st</sup> July. A main task was to make plans for and carry out detailed programs for the visiting groups, including receiving and sending off passengers from Europe and the US, conducting excursions, and handling cargo to and from EGRIP.

# Weather in Kangerlussuaq/SFJ:

Mostly sunny. Temperatures in the 15°C to 22°C range. Friday was very windy with a dry warm wind from the ice sheet and blowing dust. Blueberries and blackberries are ripe for picking.
