Weather in Kangerlussuaq/SFJ:

Several days with low clouds and little rain, also some fine days. Temperatures between -2 and 20 degrees. Mosquito situation: None left. First frosty nights. The hills are turning from green to brown. Monday and Tuesday, August 27 and 28, the FOMs will ship last cargo and close the warehouse. All vehicles will be parked in the warehouse, and the office will close Tuesday, August 28.
