#### EGRIP camp put-in April 27.

The EGRIP camp put in began with arrival of 9 persons at EGRIP at 15.20. Camp was found in good condition; but with significant snowdrift between garages and main dome. One window on the  $2^{nd}$  floor close to the former computer table had blown off the hinges and some snow had drifted inside. The window was found intact in the snow outside. The window opening was sealed with plywood. After some digging, access was made to the carpenters garage, and by 16.10 we had the 35 kW generator running.

## The following days:

The following days were spent opening more and more of camp and the opening crew was on a tight schedule as the German Basler with 4 people and another LC-130 with 10 people are scheduled to arrive by 1 May. By Sunday evening The main generator was running, both the garages were opened, several heavy vehicles started, skiway grooming was in progress, two weatherports were built and drinking water supply established.

Outside work was hampered by very rough weather conditions. It has been the coldest and most windy put-in in many years. Access to trenches has not been attempted due to adverse weather.

#### Weather at EGRIP:

Temperatures between -29C and -40 C, winds between 6 m/s and 11 m/s, turning from SW to N. Friday and Saturday blue sky, Sunday overcast and snow.

## Kangerlussuaq activities:

Picking up cargo at Air Greenland cargo terminal to 442 warehouse.

Setting up the internet, arranging the KISS kitchen and the FOM office.

Planning of cargo and the Put-in.

Vehicles operational; Ford Flatbed, Toyota Landcruiser 1984, VW Taro, the 2 Toyota forklifts, and the Toyota Landcruiser 2006.

### Weather in Kangerlussuaq/SFJ:

Upon arrival, there was still quite a lot of snow on the ground, but higher temperatures has melted quite a lot within few days. The weather has been variable with some cold and grey days, stormy days, and quite a lot of warmer days with blue sky. Temperatures between -2C to - 15C.
