EGRIP camp activities:

EGRIP camp received flights two times during this week, exchanging part of the camp crew Wednesday on skier 31 and hosting a 109th airdrop training operation Friday. In the latter operation skier 51 brought drop zone personnel and military DVs to camp, while skier 52 performed the airdrop 1nm north of the skiway. The operation was a success with 36 barrels of drill liquid be dropped in bundles with 4 drums in each. All drums were successfully recovered without any leakage. Furthermore skier 51 delivered 9800 liters of fuel to camp.

Otherwise camp hosted one photographer (documenting polar architecture) and a crew of 3 virtual reality (VR) experts producing a VR tour of EGRIP for the upcoming museum in Ilullisat.

Drilling:

The week started with a successful fishing operation recovering the drill from the bore hole after the cable had come loose the week before. As the cable did no longer spool nicely on the winch after the fishing operation, it was decided to unspool and respool the cable – and operation taking several days. Late in the week the bore hole was logged and filtered, and finally a new fishing operation had to be carried out, as two parts of the broken termination had to be recovered from the bore hole. No ice core was produced this week, except for the core recovered together with the drill Monday.

Science:

In camp the science trench processing line became fully operational Friday, and a total of 83 bags of brittle ice were processed (last bag 1729). CFA measurements were restarted (last bag 1663) and PP measurements continued (last bag 1656). On the surface the atmospheric and surface measurement programs continued as planned, with water vapor isotope drone operations restarted on Saturday. The MAGPIE project completed their measurement campaign placing and recovering stations up to 100km from camp.

Weather at EGRIP:

The week started and ended with wind from NW and snowy conditions with up to 25kts of wind Sunday. Otherwise good flying weather during the week with SW winds and only few cloudy periods. Temperatures ranged from -18°C to -4°C.

Kangerlussuaq activities:

This was a busy week with a large crew increase and exchange, 2 media groups, and a group of Danish DVs from the VILLUM Foundation and Niels Bohr Institute visiting EGRIP on June 19th with Kangerlussuaq tours on June 18th and 20th. Guido Vettoretti left the FOM office on June 17th. We hosted a group of high-ranking DVs from the 109th in camp on June 21st during the airdrop training mission and delivered a science presentation in Kangerlussuaq in the evening. We would like to express our gratitude to the 109th for a smooth collaborative event.

Late in the week, we have been preparing for the next mission scheduled for June 25th, including unpacking a container of ship cargo and repacking the contents.

Weather in Kangerlussuaq/SFJ:

Nice weather with temperatures up to 24°C in the early week. Friday-Sunday 8-15°C with unusually long periods of rain/drizzle. Mosquito level low.
