EGRIP camp activities:

This week there were two major logistical tasks in camp: 1) Handling three LC-130 landings, each with arriving and departing people (including DVs) and arriving and departing cargo, and 2) Hosting the visit of 30 Greenlandic, Danish and US high school students of the Joint Science and Education Program (JSEP) for two days. The flights required almost constant grooming of the skiway as new snow fell several times during the week. As many as 134 passengers came and went through EGRIP airport this week. The JSEP visit took some planning and preparation, and Friday to Saturday, camp population grew to 55 and two cooks were serving meals in main dome in two shifts.

Drilling:

After a sequence of runs with increasing difficulty to break the core in the borehole, the risk of having a stuck drill significantly increased. It was therefore decided to stop deep drilling for 2019, and use the offseason to come up with new procedures and engineering solutions to the problem. After drilling was halted, the borehole was filtered and later the borehole was recorded with the borehole logger. Final 2019 logged depth: 2122.42 m Continued shallow drilling at S7 to 84 m.

Science:

The science trench was fully operational until Saturday and this week bags 3587 to 3856 were processed (i.e. 269 bags processed in total). Bag 3856 (2120.80m) is the final processed bag of 2019. In the CFA cabin a total of 147 bags where measured (3323-3470), while the PP measurements reached bag 3715. Saturday was the big Joint Science and Education Program (JSEP) day. Greenlandic, Danish and US high school students were participating in ice core processing, snow pit studies and other scientific camp activities.

On the surface atmospheric and surface measurements continued as planned.

Two new projects started this Saturday: Testing of four radars from University of Alabama and the Danish rover project.

EGRIP Camp Population: 23, with a maximum (Friday-Sunday) of 55.

Weather at EGRIP:

Cloudy with sunny spells in the middle of the week. Some light snow fall. Otherwise fine. Temperatures in beginning of week -8C to -2C, later becoming -8C to -18C. Winds 3 – 5 m/s from SW to NNW.

Kangerlussuaq activities:

It has been the most busy week this season with three LC-130 flights to camp combined with DV visit and the High school students from JSEP. Eight pallets with food, supplies and the Alabama radar were packed and eight pallets received. The ice core freezer in Kangerlussauq is now almost full; but shipment of the ice will await the very last samples that arrive from camp in August. All week there have been EGRIPpers in KISS, some on the way to camp and some returning from camp. All available vehicles have been in full swing. The FOMs have been giving talks to the JSEP students and the DVs were taken on several excursions to sights in the area and to the ice sheet margin.

Weather in Kangerlussuaq/SFJ:

Dry and mostly sunny. Temperatures between 22C and 8C. Very few mosquitos.
