Drilling:

All drilling activities have stopped. EGRIP deep drilling completed. The drill trench setup will remain for tests of replicate coring in 2024.

Science:

There has been no scientific activity this week.

Weather at EGRIP:

Overcast with fog and light snow. Due to snowfall and strong wind, the skiway had deteriorated and the planned load had to be reduced. Wind between 14 kt from NW. Temperature -10 C.

Kangerlussuaq activities:

Receiving cargo from camp. Hosting annual 109th dinner at Rowclub. Sorting cargo and preparing cargo for Müllers Ice Cap project. Filling two 20' containers with ship cargo to Denmark. Interviews with journalists. Cleaning up in warehouse 442. Handing over Flexmobiles to DTU Arctic, Sisimiut.

Weather in Kangerlussuaq/SFJ:

Weather has been fine. Mosquito count is reduced; still swarms of small black flies tend to disturb the peace.
